

- NLS map news OS 1900 Text Search view distributions of text from OS Six-Inch 1888-1913 maps
  Are you interested in searching for places or features on Ordnance Survey Six-Inch maps of England,
  Scotland, and Wales from just over a century ago? The new OS 1900 Text search application queries 2.5
  million transcriptions from the GB1900 dataset. The GB1900 project ran from September 2016 to January
  2018, and through a successful volunteer collaboration, collected all the text from the OS Six-Inch maps for
  1888-1913. The new interface is much improved, being faster, with better wildcard search options, and
  results. It returns the parish and nation the places are within, as well as geographic distributions of the
  particular names or text on the map you have searched for. You can easily save or export images of the
  resulting distributions or download the results as CSV, KML or GeoJSON files for onward use.
